MONDAY WORKSHOP: AUTISM AT HOME OR IN THE CLASSROOM

ABOUT AMAZING K THERAPY & REMEDIAL ACADEMY

The course is presented by Ilse Kilian-Ross, a mother of a teenage autistic. She is also the owner of Amazing K Therapy & Remedial Academy in Randburg. She has created a centre where learning goes hand-in-hand with therapy and kindness for children with special needs.

Amazing K started as an autism school in January 2014 in Northwold. In 2017 a second centre was opened in Sharonlea, Johannesburg. At the beginning of 2020 it was one of the biggest private Autism Schools in South Africa.
